Billing and Customer Service	Jennie Pate reviewed the Billing and Customer Service Reports for May and June, 2025.
	This included a comparison of membership numbers for 2024 and 2025. The data shows that in June, 2024, there were 14,212 members and in June, 2025, there were 14,320.
	The Collections Summary Reports for May and June were presented.
	In May, a total of \$6,226.64 was submitted for collection, with \$0 being collected by GLA and \$0 by Shelby Energy.
	In June, a total of \$4,066.34 was submitted for collection, with \$137.06 being collected by GLA and \$266.77 by Shelby Energy.
